

## **Install**

Place the Clipboarder folder in your Macros folder. It should show under Macros menu right away.

## **How it Works**

Select some text and use the Clipboarder *Copy* or *Cut* command. It will place the text in the next available spot in the Nisus Clipboard stack. If there is not a spot, it will create a new one. The macro will also save the text to a file at the same time.

The macro creates a *Saved Clipboards* folder (if it doesn't exist) in the same folder where your *Macros* folder resides. Within the *Saved Clipboards* the macro creates a folder specific to the document you're working on. It does this by naming the folder a lowercase version of the document title, replacing spaces with hyphens. Choosing the Paste macro presents a list of first eighty characters of each clipboard including the primary clipboard.

When you're done with the document, close it knowing your clipboards have been saved to disk. They are also still in the Nisus clipboard stack. They will clear when you quit Nisus Writer. **Or, you can reset the clipboards or the location where clipboards are saved by choosing the *Paste* or *Restore* macros with no documents open OR select the *ClipboardUtility* macro.**

Just choose *Reset*. As you can see this also offers a shortcut to the *Saved Clipboards* folder if you want to do some housekeeping.

## **Restoring Saved Clipboards**

Use the *Restore* macro to restore the clipboard stack so you can access the text when you revisit the document they are associated with. Note, if you change the name of the document the macro won't be able to find the saved files. This is easily remedied

by changing the name of the folder using the lowercase and hyphen for spaces convention mentioned above.

### **Suggested Keyboard**

I set the following keyboard shortcuts which work really well. Two of the shortcuts displace existing commands, but, for me at least, the commands are not ones I use often.

Command-Option-C for Copy

Command-Option-X for Cut

Command-Option-V for Paste

Command-Option-R for Restore
